- 2. Captain Mitchell is an outstanding performer in every aspect. He is a tactical expert as an Intelligence Officer who spent years working mission crew, volunteering to work nights, weekends, holidays to defend our nation and its interests abroad. He served as the Chief of Training for the 184th Intelligence, Surveillance and Reconnaissance Group, expertly guiding over 330 personnel through a transition from legacy operations to a next generation construct. He was hand-selected by Wing leadership to serve as both the Wing's Drug Demand Reduction Program Officer, and the Federal Program Manager for Kansas STARBASE. He is also engaged in the local community, seeking to impact the lives of Kansans and make it a better place to live, work, and raise a family. SUBJECT: Outstanding Air Company Grade Officer of the Year Award (Captain Douglas Mitchell)

- 1. It is my pleasure to nominate Captain Douglas Mitchell for Kansas Company Grade Officer of the Year for his outstanding leadership, loyalty, and initiatives in military and public service.
- 2. Captain Mitchell voluntarily deployed to Korea where he served as the Unit Support Officer in Charge of the Analysis, Correlation and Fusion Flight at the 607th Air Operations Center. In this role he took initiative to re-align Request for Information and Flying Unit Coordination processes to conform with doctrinal guidance. His astute leadership provided support to intelligence professionals and flying operations across the Korean peninsula, and his briefings and products supported decision making for the theater's Air Component Commander, Lieutenant General Scott Pleus. Captain Mitchell's team provided 1,547 mission reports and analytic assessments, 28 adversary threat system updates, and 12 mission summaries. Their efforts ensured the safety of pilots from 15 flying squadrons engaged in combat operations ensuring peace on the peninsula. In part due to Captain Mitchell and his team's incredible support, the Intelligence, Surveillance and Reconnaissance Division was named the Pacific Air Forces ISR Unit of the Year.
- 3. Closer to home, Captain Mitchell served as Flight Commander for Bravo Flight, an Analysis and Exploitation Team in the 161st Intelligence Squadron focused on providing answers to Priority Intelligence Requirements of the Commander, United States Northern Command, the 601st Air and Space Operations Center at Tyndall AFB, Florida, and the 611th Air Operations Center at Joint Base Elmendorf-Richardson, Alaska. Through astute understanding of tactical, operational and strategic alignment, he led the way in calibrating operations with the National Defense Strategy, the Air Force ISR Flight Plan, and the Air Combat Command Next Generation Concept of Operations. Captain Mitchell's efforts enabled revolutionary intelligence fusion support to defend the homeland against air threats, counter adversary malign influence, and detect adversary intelligence collection activities. Captain Mitchell accomplished all this while administratively leading a flight of 37 intelligence analysts, ensuring training, readiness, morale, and full-scope care of his airmen.
- 4. Further, Captain Mitchell holds important responsibilities in the 184th Wing and the Kansas National Guard. He served as the Wing Drug Demand Reduction Program Officer, ensuring

testing of over 1,300 Wing members annually to prevent drug abuse through education, outreach, and awareness programs and detecting and deterring personnel from using illicit drugs and misusing prescription drugs. Additionally, Captain Mitchell also served as the Federal Program Manager for Kansas STARBASE. In this role he oversaw the federal funding and execution for the STARBASE program across five locations throughout the state, a \$2.6 million budget, its 28 employees, and board of directors. His efforts helped ignite the interest of thousands of Kansas youth in science, math, technology, engineering, goal setting, and positive life choices by exposing them to the positive role models and technological environments of the Kansas Air and Army National Guard.

5. Finally, Captain Mitchell is the embodiment of a citizen Guardsman as he works in the local community. Even when deployed to Korea he volunteered to coach pickleball for children of service members, working at a local camp to enrich the lives of 26 families and 40 children stationed far from home. He also heavily invests in the youth of central Kansas, where he served as the head coach for the Wichita Police Department's Wolfpack youth wrestling team for ten years, and as a track coach for Wichita Southeast High School. His efforts build strong kids and families around the Wichita area, and reflect positively on the Kansas National Guard. Captain Mitchell is an active annual member of the National Guard Association of Kansas and the National Guard Association of the United States.

CAPTAIN DOUGLAS C. MITCHELL

Capt. Douglas C. Mitchell is the Wing Executive Officer, 184th Wing, Kansas Air National Guard, McConnell Air Force Base, Kansas. He assists and advises the Wing Commander in directing, coordinating, and implementing executive functions for a diverse wing of over 1,300 Guardsmen engaged in a broad spectrum of missions including intelligence surveillance and reconnaissance, cyber operations, and command and control. Capt. Mitchell is a career intelligence officer with the 184th Intelligence, Surveillance and Reconnaissance Group, which operates the SENTINEL weapon system as Distributed Ground Station - Kansas. He has been a certified Instructor and Evaluator for the weapon system.

Capt. Mitchell was commissioned into the Air Force and Kansas Air National Guard through the Academy of Military Science in December 2012 and completed technical training at Goodfellow Air Force Base, Texas in 2013. He has supported contingency operations around the world, providing critical intelligence to warfighters and Combatant Commanders during Operations FREEDOM'S SENTINEL, INHERENT RESOLVE, and ALLIES REFUGE. He led operations crews as a Mission Operations Commander of Full-Motion Video and High Altitude Command and Control Elements. Capt. Mitchell was also hand-selected as the 184th Wing's Drug Demand Reduction Program Officer and the



Federal Program Manager for Kansas STARBASE. Prior to his current assignment, Capt. Mitchell was the Flight Commander for Bravo Flight, 161st Intelligence Squadron, where he led an Analysis and Exploitation Team answering Air Component Priority Intelligence Requirements in support of United States Northern Command.

Capt. Mitchell served in civilian law enforcement for over 15 years as a patrol officer, equestrian patrol, community policing, police liaison to the Kansas Department of Corrections Director, and Airport Police and Fire Officer. During this time Captain Mitchell received notable award, including the Kansas Chiefs of Police Gold Award for Valor and Kansas Department of Corrections Contract Employee of the Year.
