SUBJECT: Senate Appropriations Committee FY22 DoD Appropriations Review

BLUF: The Senate Appropriations Committee released its Fiscal Year (FY) 2022 Department of Defense (DoD) appropriations legislation on 18 October. Next step: Senate Appropriations Committee considers FY22 DoD appropriations legislation.

Funding levels and provisions cited below are proposed by the Senate Appropriations Committee only and are subject to change.

Summary funding: SAC-D recommended **\$728.9 billion** in funding for DOD, includes:

- \$728.9 billion in DoD base and discretionary funding
- 1. Army National Guard.
  - Recommended ARNG end strength of 336,000 Soldiers (500 less than FY21 levels)
  - \$630.3 million for 24 UH-60Black Hawk M model helicopters for the Army
    - o The FY22 PB request included \$776.3 million for 24 UH-60M aircraft for the Army
  - \$479.1 million to modernize 30 AH-64 Apache Block IIIA helicopters for the Army
    - The FY22 PB request included \$504.1 million and 30 aircraft designated for the Army
  - \$166.2 million for 24 UH-60 L and V model (UH-60V) helicopters for the Army
    - Consistent with FY22 request, which included \$166.2 million and 24 aircraft designated for the Army
  - \$120.7 million for the High Mobility Multipurpose Wheeled Vehicle (HMMWV) program for the Army
  - \$694.6 for Joint Light Tactical Vehicles (JLTVs) for the Army
  - \$145.2 million for 6 CH-47 Chinook helicopters for the Army
  - \$18.5 million for CH-47 Chinook advanced procurement for the Army
  - \$1.1 billion for the Abrams Upgrade Program to modernize 90 M1 Abrams tanks for the Army
    - Adds 20 additional M1 Abrams

## 2. Air National Guard.

- Recommended ANG end strength at 108,300 airmen (200 more than FY21 levels)
- \$1.98 billion for 16 additional C-130J Super Hercules aircraft designated for the ANG
- \$4.1 billion for 48 F-35A Lightning II aircraft for the Air Force
- \$1.1 billion for 12 F-15EX aircraft for the Air Force
- \$2.3 billion for 14 KC-46A Pegasus aircraft for the Air Force
- \$62.5 million for the HH-60W Combat Rescue Helicopter program for the Air Force
- An additional \$5.6 million towards HMMWV modernization for the Air Force

## 3. Joint-Personnel.

- \$1.45 billion for the National Guard and Reserve Equipment Account (NGREA) placing the Guard percentage of the fund at 60%, includes:
  - o \$435.0 million for the ARNG
  - \$435.0 million for the ANG
- \$50.8 million additional for ARNG MILCON for projects on the Unfunded Priorities List
- \$66.5 million additional for ANG MILCON for projects on the Unfunded Priorities List
- \$194.2 million for the National Guard Counter-drug Program
- \$25.7 million for National Guard Counter-drug schools
- Additional \$85.2 million above the PB for the National Guard Youth ChalleNGe program
- Additional \$42.0 million above the PB for STARBASE
- Additional \$14.6 million above the PB for NG wildfire training
