Modernize the Guard - Protect the Future

Issue

National Guard and Reserve Equipment Account (NGREA) fills critical gaps and allows the Guard to procure high-priority equipment when service budgets do not move fast enough or do not fully account for Guard needs. Since 1981, this congressionally added procurement account has addressed equipment shortfalls and supported evolving operational requirements across the reserve component.

Why it matters

Without NGREA, critical National Guard equipment gaps persist longer, readiness suffers, and the Guard's ability to respond quickly at home and overseas is put at greater risk. NGREA gives Congress a proven, flexible way to invest directly in the National Guard and ensure the force remains prepared for the missions it is asked to carry out every day.
