1. Army National Guard (ARNG) and Air National Guard (ANG) Comptrollers, United States Property and Fiscal Officers, and the Program/Resources and Comptroller Directorate will provide oversight for tracking and obligating funds for attendance and transportation to the NGAUS and the EANGUS conferences, in accordance with the references.

2. All federally funded National Guard travel to the conferences will be within limits set in the attached table, which authorizes travel-funding levels using existing resources, for the ARNG, ANG, National Guard Bureau Joint Staff, States, Territories, and the District of Columbia. No additional federal funds will be provided for travel to NGAUS and EANGUS conferences.

3. National Guard Bureau Personnel with authorization to use federal funds will provide their name, Travel Authorization Number, and the total amount spent in the Defense Travel System no later than 10 days after participating in the conference to the points of contact below. Guest speakers attending will be paid for by the owning organization per reference a.
