- 1. Federally funded National Guard travel to the National Guard Association of the United States (NGAUS) and Enlisted Association of the National Guard of the United States (EANGUS) conferences will be limited to the amounts in the attachment, using existing resources and in accordance with the references.
- 2. No additional Federal funds will be provided. The Programs and Resources/Comptroller Directorate (NGB-J8) and the Office of the National Guard Bureau Chief Counsel will approve alternative funding of travel costs for organizations hosting an exhibit booth. Guest speakers will be paid for by the owning organization per reference a.
- 3. Attendees will be grade O-3 and below and W2 and below for the NGAUS conference and E-6 and below for the EANGUS conference. U.S. Property and Fiscal Officers and NGB-J8 will oversee tracking and obligating funds for the conferences. Within 10 days after the conference, participants must provide their name, Travel Authorization Number, and total spent in the Defense Travel System to the points of contact.
