BLUF: President Donald Trump signed H.R. 133 - Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2021 into law on 27 December 2020. Included is Division C – Department of Defense (DoD) Appropriations Act, 2021 legislation.

Summary funding: Division C outlines **\$695.9 billion** in total funding for DoD, includes:

- \$627.3 billion in DoD base and discretionary funding
- \$68.6 billion in Overseas Contingency Operations (OCO) funding

1. Army National Guard.

- Recommends ARNG end strength at 336,500 soldiers (500 more than FY20 levels)
- \$862.0 million for UH-60 Black Hawk M model helicopters for the Army
 - \$119.0 million program increase above FY21 request,
 - i. FY21 request included \$492.0 million for 23 UH-60M aircraft for the ARNG
 - ii. Program increase includes \$141.0 million for 6 additional HH-60M for ARNG
- \$165.1 million to modernize UH-60 A and L model (UH-60V) helicopters for the Army
 - Consistent with FY21 request, which included \$100.8 million and 14 aircraft designated for the ARNG
- \$792.0 million to modernize AH-64 Apache Block IIIA helicopters for the Army
- \$169.4 million for AH-64 Apache Block IIIB advanced procurement for the Army
- \$320.7 million for CH-47 Chinook helicopters for the Army
- \$47.3 million for CH-47 Chinook advanced procurement for the Army
- \$100.0 million for ARNG HMMWV modernization program
- \$884.4 million for Joint Light Tactical Vehicles (JLTVs) for the Army
 - Consistent with FY21 request, which included \$95.8 million designated for the ARNG
- \$968.0 million for the Abrams Upgrade Program to modernize M1 Abrams tanks for the Army

2. Air National Guard.

- Recommends ANG end strength at 108,100 airmen (400 more than FY20 levels)
- \$797.0 million for C-130J Super Hercules aircraft designated for the ANG and AFRC
 - Includes \$570.0 million for 6 C-130Js designated to 'only' the ARNG
- \$265.5 million for C-130 modernization
 - Includes \$180.0 million for NP2000 propeller upgrades
 - Includes \$79.0 million for T-56 Series 3.5 engine modifications
- \$5.6 billion for F-35A Lightning II aircraft for the Air Force
- \$1.2 billion for F-15EX aircraft for the Air Force
- \$2.6 billion for KC-46A Pegasus aircraft for the Air Force
- \$909.9 million for HH-60W Combat Rescue Helicopters for the Air Force

3. Joint-Personnel.

- Three percent military personnel pay increase
- \$950.0 million for the National Guard and Reserve Equipment Account (NGREA), includes:
 - \$285.0 million for the ARNG
 - \$285.0 million for the ANG
- \$194.2 million for the National Guard Counterdrug Program
 - Program increase of \$100.0 million over FY21 request
- \$25.5 million for National Guard Counterdrug schools
 - Program increase of \$20.0 million over FY21 request
- Additional \$75.2 million for the National Guard Youth ChalleNGe program
- Additional \$41.1 million for STARBASE
- Additional \$1.5 million for wildfire training
