Cyber: Remains A Growth Industry



- Ferguson, Missouri; Baltimore, Maryland; and Flint, Michigan have all had cyber activity associated with these civil unrest events.
- Expect every civil support/domestic operations mission will have a cyber component that must be managed by civil and military leaders.
- National Guard is being included in national plans for whole-ofgovernment response to cyber threats
- 2018 Election Support National Guard combined with 27 States and Federal partners

The Non-Federalized Response





- Emergency Management Assistance Compact processes work well in small to medium disasters
- Need new strategies at the National Level on how to conduct a response to territories, remote states, and states degraded by the circumstances
- Rapid reimbursement from Federal Emergency Management Agency to reduce supporting states fiscal stress
- Emergency Management Assistance Compact process during catastrophically disabled state governments
