DARNG's Intent

Unclassified

- Posture ARNG Divisions toward Large-Scale Ground Combat Operations (LSGCO) in support of the National Defense Strategy.
- Prepare ARNG Divisions and lower echelon units for Multi-Domain Operations (MDO).
- Establish a training association between ARNG Divisions and doctrinal associated (subordinate) units and enablers (i.e. BCTs, CABs, MEBs, SUST BDE, and future Division Artillery (DIVARTYs)).
 - Provide ARNG Divisions with aligned units and enablers so they could be used interchangeably with AC Divisions in LSGCO.
 - Synchronizes the training and development of leaders from Squad to Division level.
 - Generate increased readiness across Division formations.
- Support the ARNG Division Commanders in optimizing Division training readiness.
- Establish ARNG Divisions able to align with Army Corps and a Theater Army

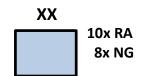


Gap 6 – Corps/Division HQs Optimized for COIN, Not Survivable

Gap #6: EAB HQs not optimized for LSGCO – lack airspace control, fires integration, smaller command posts. Not mobile or survivable. MCPOD in RC reduces RA readiness. MEBs in Compo 2 and 3 reduces RA readiness.

 When viewed holistically, attacks one critical imperative supporting the NSS/NDS – the need to regain overmatch and transition our predominately COIN centric structure to one that can prevail in LSGCO today on the path to an MDO 2028 and beyond force.



- All 18 Army Divisions would reflect the same design
- Optimized for LSGCO: DIV replaces BCTs as the predominant Unit of Action
- Leaner design inherently dependent on DIVARTY, MEB, SUST BDE highlighting need for development of formal relationships
 - RA DIV dependent on RC MCP-OD and MEB
 - ARNG DIV lacks DIVARTY, addressed in TAA 22-26 with 1 x DIVARTY with the rest competed in next two TAAs; end state is 8 x DIVARTY

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Division Alignment for Training (Opportunities, Risks, & Mitigation)

OPPORTUNITIES

- Provides the Total Army 8 organized
 ARNG Divisions, creating potential for
 2 additional Corps and a Theater Army
 - DIV CDRs provide training guidance and oversee training development for MDO
- Talent management collaboration between DIV CDRs and TAGs
- Creates training and professional development opportunities from Company to Division level

RISK (to Mission/Force)

- Current Division alignment not synchronized with Unit Readiness Cycle (URC) and CTC/WFX rotational cycles
- Division alignment is not synchronized with the Global Force Management Allocation Plan
- Prioritization of resources across state lines (OMNG, NGPA, Equipping, etc.)

MITIGATION

- Synchronization of Unit Readiness Cycle with proposed Division alignment
- Execute a pilot program for 2 Divisions in FY20 before aligning the remaining 6
- Prioritize resourcing to the Divisions

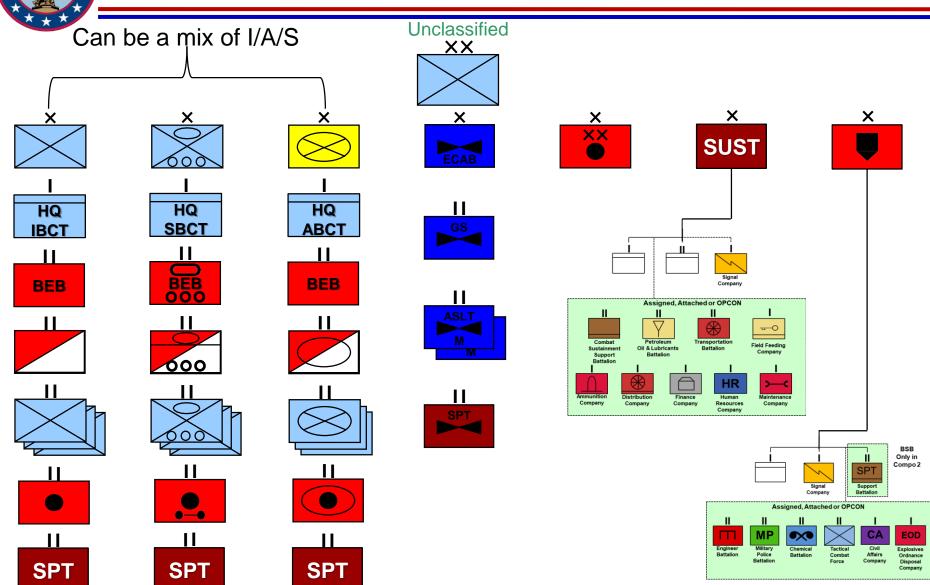
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Generic Division Alignment

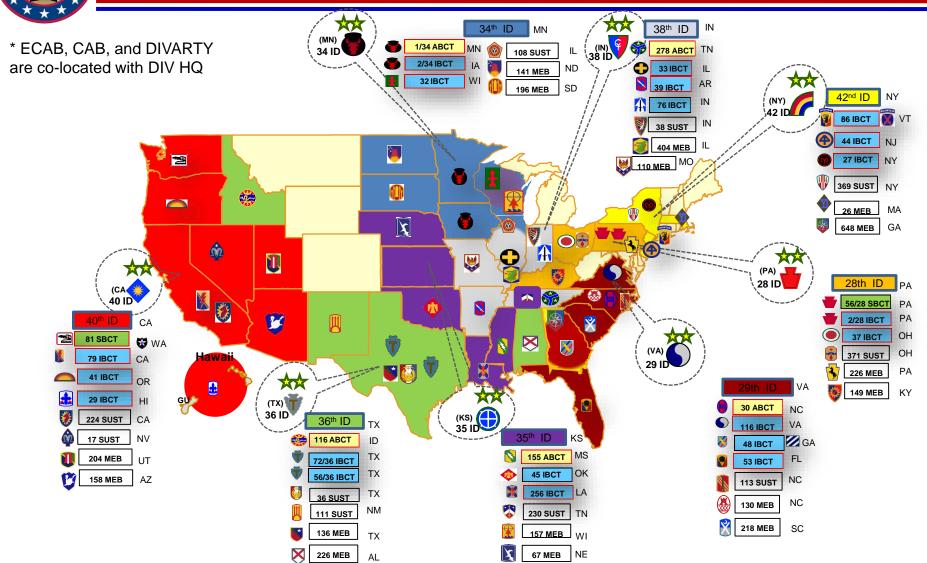

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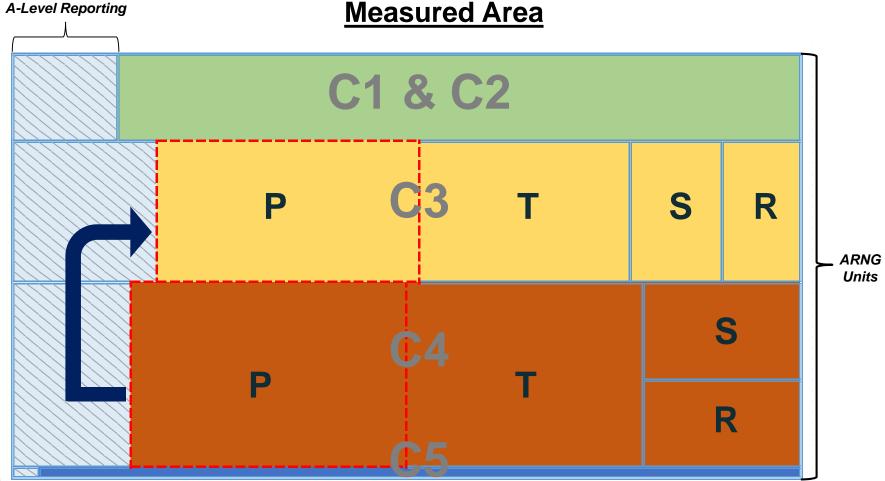
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ARNG Produced Readiness

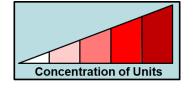

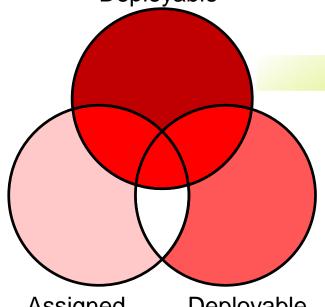
C3 – Non A Level Reporting Units

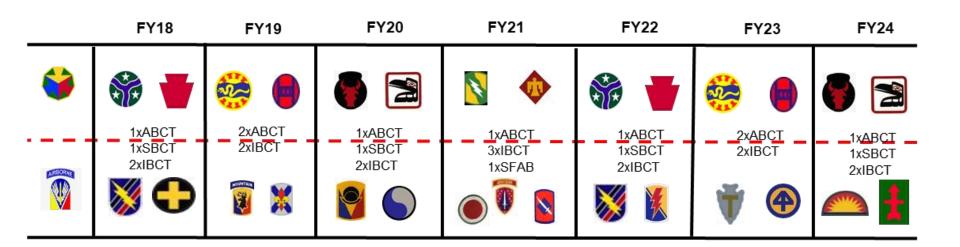

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CURRENT CTC Rotation Schedule

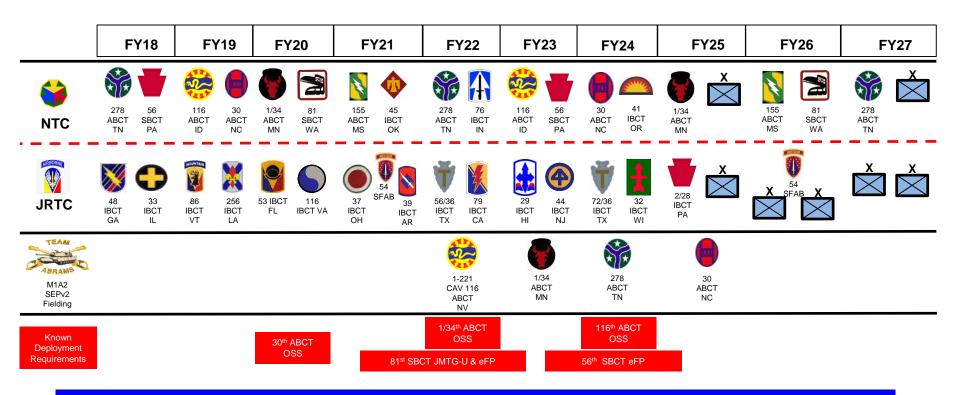
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Proposed ARNG CTC Rotation Strategy Update

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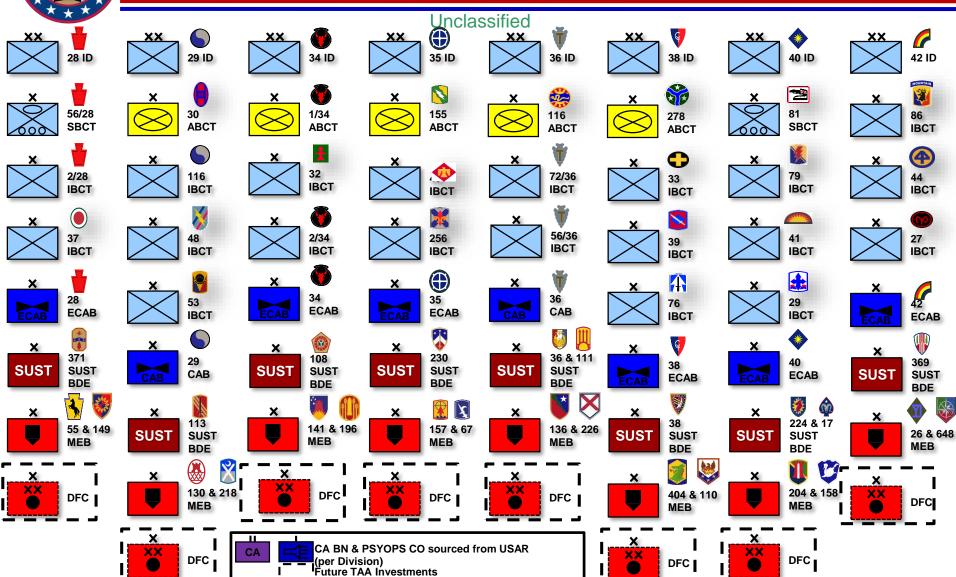
KEY POINTS:

- Both FY20 & 21 Rotations are locked with FORSCOM & States
- 12 of 20 IBCTs will have completed at least one Decisive Action Training Environment (DATE) CTC Rotation by FY21
- All ARNG IBCTs will have at least one DATE CTC Rotation by FY25
- Further analysis is required to determine the optimal CTC Dwell that maximizes ARNG Total Obligation Authority (TOA) Flexibility FY25 and beyond
